

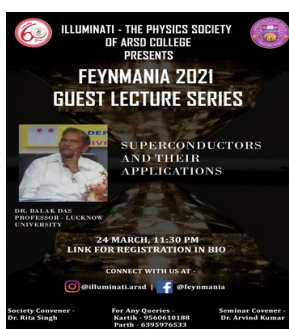
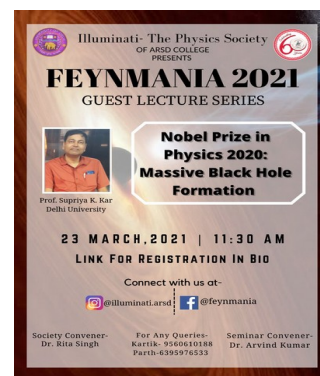
ILLUMINATI- The Physics Society

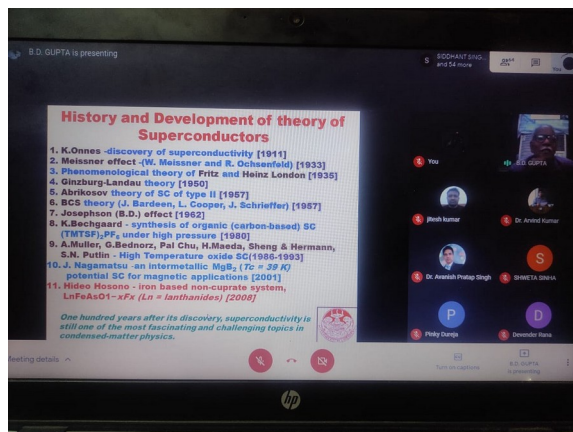
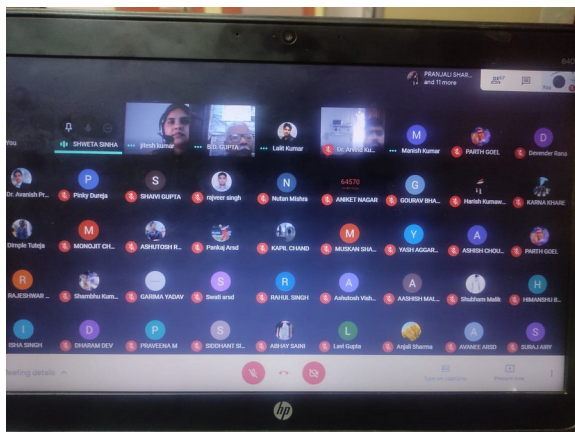
